We will learn about a student internship project in inner city Utica that was to evaluate a municipal housing project, HOPE VI, through pictures of residents, interviews with mostly minority residents, with staff and others, and through research on the history of the multi-ethnic neighborhood, produced over a 5-year period. The student project resulted in a question about such stories: whose story gets told and from whose point of view?

Dr. Judith Owens-Manley is Community Research Director at Hamilton College. She creates and manages community-based learning projects involving Hamilton students, including a Community Garden at Adrean Terrace, Project SHINE (Students Helping in the Naturalization of Elders) and VITA (Voluntary Income Tax Assistance). She teaches in the Government Department, including a course on Immigration and Refugees.

Moises Toledano is a student at Hamilton College who will graduate in 2009.
